Downtown Connectivity Improvements Update

Summary:

The Downtown Connectivity Improvements project was developed to meet the City Council's strategic objective of a more active and economically vibrant central city. As with many significant capital improvement projects the Downtown Connectivity Improvements has been progressing through a project development process for the past several years. This phase of project development often occurs quietly with little public awareness. This past year the project achieved a significant milestone by attracting a package of grant funds that ensures its feasibility and allows the City to firmly plan for its delivery. During this workshop staff intends to refresh the City Council on the project development history, the grant funding and agency support achieved in recent years, and the staff's plan for completing the project delivery.
