Stormwater Retrofit Project Development – Public Outreach (30 minutes)

Summary:

The purpose of this workshop is to present the features of a public outreach program that staff intends to implement in preparation for seeking Council selection of stormwater system water quality improvement project alternatives.

Public Works has spent the past few months reformulating the Leslie Groves Infiltration Basin project and developing several other stormwater system water quality improvement projects. The entire package of projects has been developed to include multiple design alternatives that will be evaluated by staff and the public through a thorough public outreach program. These projects will be funded by existing secured Washington State grants and City Stormwater Utility funds.

Staff will present an overview of the projects' design alternatives and an outline for a thorough public outreach program.
