Little Badger Mountain Trail (30 minutes)

Summary:

The purpose of this discussion is to overview the Friends of Badger Mountain (FOBM) plan to connect the existing trail network from Benton County's Badger Mountain Centennial Preserve to existing Richland-owned lands to the east on Little Badger Mountain, through the area commonly known as the Badger Mountain Saddle. The item is generally included in the City's newly adopted 2019-2025 Parks and Recreation Master Plan and portions of the project are included in the City's existing Capital Improvement Plan.

The Parks and Recreation Commission recommends approval of a Park Partnership Grant to FOBM. Staff delayed forwarding the grant award for Council consideration pending a discussion of land ownership and maintenance responsibilities because the grant award is conditioned upon public ownership of the land currently owned by FOBM. A common understanding of the various land transactions, trail alignments, and roles and responsibilities will benefit the City and FOBM.
