North-South Capacity Study - Progress Update (15 minutes)

Summary:

The purpose of this workshop session is to provide Council with a status report regarding the North-South Travel Capacity Study. The Study's final stage of public involvement has begun. To date, the City's consultant, JUB Engineers, has completed a significant public engagement process, mostly involving convening a Technical Advisory Committee and working with that Committee to identify and evaluate alternative improvements to reduce congestion and prepare capacity for anticipated growth. With the Committee's work and the consultant's technical work complete, the preliminary study results were published to the City's web site on Monday, October 14, 2019, launching the general public involvement process. The keystone event in this last phase of the study is a public open house held this past Wednesday evening at the Red Lion Hotel.

Staff will share with Council a summary of the study process, results, and preliminary summary of the public input gathered at the open house and through the on-line survey.

Benton-Franklin Council of Governments (BFCOG) Funding Distribution Priorities (30 minutes)

Summary:

The purpose of this workshop session is to present staff's recommended package of funding applications for the upcoming Benton Franklin Council of Governments (BFCG) federal transportation funds distribution. The BFCG is expected to open its application period before the end of October and require applications be submitted in early November. Staff has selected projects and programs from the proposed 2020 - 2025 Capital Improvement Plan, and will seek Council concurrence and guidance relative to its recommendations. With input received from Council, staff will prepare a resolution for the November 5 Council meeting seeking Council's formal authorization to make applications to the BFCG programs.
