MULTI-PURPOSE WALL AT BADGER MOUNTAIN PARK

Proposal to City of Richland, Parks and Public Facilities Department

Request:

Richland Lacrosse is requesting the approval for installation of a multi-purpose wall on the east end of the basketball court at Badger Mountain Park. The wall will be 14-foot tall by 35-foot long by 1 foot deep, constructed of reinforced poured concrete. See figure 1 on page 2.

Purpose:

- Provide a multi-purpose wall that allows Badger Mountain Park users to play and practice a variety of ball-centered sports. This includes, but is not limited to, basketball, pickle ball, lacrosse, dodge ball, and tennis.
- Provide shade to basketball court users during the morning hours.

Cost of materials and installation:

- Richland Lacrosse will pay for the materials and installation of the wall. After installation the wall will be donated to the city.
- Preliminary review of irrigation schematics indicate that one or two sprinkler heads will need to be relocated and/or installed. Richland Lacrosse will also provide for these costs.

Recurring maintenance cost:

Richland Lacrosse will provide for the maintenance, upkeep, and vandalism repair needed for the wall.

Engineering:

Local, licensed contractor, Premier Landscaping, will provide all engineering, materials, and construction services. Prior to construction, the contractor will submit an engineering plan for approval and obtain all necessary permits.

Safety:

The wall is designed to be high enough that extraordinary measures would be required to scale it. In other words, the wall is not easily climbed by park users. Signs will be posted prohibiting climbing on the wall.

Notes from December 12 Workshop on PRC 2020 Goals and Objectives

The Commission generally agreed on the outline of five objectives within three established goals as follows:

Goal 1 – Work with staff... to provide programs and recreational activities...

Objective 1 – Capitalize through partnerships and advocacy on the Visit Tri Cities recommendations to expand Hanford Legacy Park to meet growing needs for multipurpose fields.

Goal 2 – Support staff in identifying and prioritizing unique natural habitat...

Objective 1 – Partner with Friends of Badger Mountain to establish the long term vision and Master Plan for the Little Badger Mountain trail system.

Objective 2 – Support staff in coordinating with the Corps of Engineers to validate and establish a non-motorized zone in Leslie Groves Park between the shoreline and Nelson Island.

Goal 3 – Promote user friendliness and safety...

Objective 1 – Obtain public input on priorities and how to best manage safety concerns within Richland Parks and Trails.

Objective 2 – Coordinate with Public Works in establishing mitigated measures (e.g. speed, signage, restrictions) for electronically assisted bikes and scooters on Richland Parks Trails.
